Person with dementia

Label of the society
High level of rationality
and functionality

Family caregiver

- "disconnected of" and "dissociated from" the society
- Realize to default social expectation and demands
- ostracism and risk of isolation


- "confrontation" with the "disconnection" of the person with dementia
- Coping with diverse stress situations
- Stress and burden due to loss of autonomy and care dependency of the person with dementia
- Stress due to privatisation of the problem





Society of Participation and Diversity

- Participation as a (socio-) political guiding concept
 - Economic participation
 Financial opportunity of self-controlling
 - Political participation
 Participation and involvement in public decision processes
 - Cultural participation participation in cultural life and educational processes
 - Social participation
 Particiation in networks in the social environment (family friendships, neighborhood) as well as social settings (municipality, clubs, associatrions etc.)
 - Dementia as a part of diversity of society

Family caregiver

Micro level

- Rights
 - Prevention of discrimination
 - Reduction of barriers
- Duties
 - Political involvement as citizens (democratic theoretical)
 - Sensibility regarding the consequences of acting and decision making for all generations

Meso / Macro level

- Enabling structures for involvement and participation
- Ageing mainstreaming
 - Incorporation of all aspects of ageing in political decision making processes
 - Consideration of the impact of decisions for all age groups

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Function of the community

Community/ Commonwealth (Meso)

- To assume responsibility by removal of taboos
- To enable an atmosphere that is suitable for people with dementia
 - Living with dementia in the community
- Openness towards the "disconnection" of the society
 - More people with dementia, more famliy caregivers

Municipality/ State (Macro)

- Dementia as a task of public welfare system
- Provision of ressources for
 - Medical
 - Nursing
 - Psychosocial care
- Change of perspective
 - Away from a funcional care perspective to a bio-psycho-social perspective






Successful active ageing A proverb ...
