# Cross-border public health cooperation in diversified themes

2022 has been an inspiring year for euPrevent. While the COVID-19 pandemic slowly came to an end, its long-term impact on many people's health and life has become increasingly noticeable. The healthcare system is being confronted with new challenges. Meanwhile, in the aftermath of the flood catastrophe of 2021, the topic of environmental health and climate consequences for health in Euroregions has increasingly come into focus. We therefore focused on a diverse set of health challenges across borders.

## euPrevent's achievements in 2022

In 2022, we expanded our working territory to cover various border regions between the Netherlands, Belgium and Germany. Once again, we have worked hard to promote cooperation among different health organisations in the border region.



7 new partners have joined our network (total number of partners: 170), including GGD Limburg Noord, Gesundheitsämter of Düsseldorf, Rhein-Kreis Neuss, Viersen, Krefeld, Mönchengladbach and Caritas Euskirchen.

### Project ACP (Active Citizenship Participation)

The goal of the project ACP is to establish a framework for structural citizen participation that will be embedded in the cross-border decision-making process in the Meuse-Rhine Euroregion, starting with the theme 'Climate change and health'. After implementation, other health-related issues with similar transboundary features will also be integrated in the participation framework.
