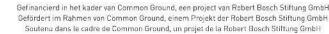














# Project background – Goal

(EMR)

Initially, the project focused on the cross-border theme of climate change and health.

## 1.3 Project implementation

- Project duration: September 2022 August 2025
- German StadtRaumMonitor was adapted into Euregional version: The Place Standard Tool Euregio Meuse Rhine (PST EMR)
- Train the trainer session on the application of the PST was held
- Ensuring political visibility
  - Dialogues, presentations and recommendations to policymakers, politicians & stakeholders
- Citizen Participation events
- Online tool



# Place Standard Tool Euregio Meuse-Rhine (PST EMR)

#### What is it?

- The Place Standard Tool helps citizens discuss their living environment based on five key themes:
  - Mobility
  - Public Space
  - Supplies / Housing / Education & Economy
  - Social Interaction
  - Climate Adaptation
- Citizens give a score from 1 to 7, but strength lies in qualitative discussion

#### What is new in the ACP project?

- Made the tool euregional
  - Questions about neighboring countries
  - Translations to German, Dutch, French, English
- Added climate-focused questions
- Adapted it for multiple uses



# ACP – Engagement throughout the EMR



### Citizen summits: Format overview

#### Why this format?

 In depth perspectives on climate change & health through group discussions

#### How did it work?

- Moderated group (8 15 participants)
- PST EMR as guide
- Exclusive focus: Climate change and health

#### Where?

- Düren and Kerkrade (Fall 2024)
- Online summit (December 2024)
- Group discussion AIGS Belgium (February 2025)
- Citizen Summit in Heinsberg in Spring 2025

#### Who?

- Euregional Citizens (age 17 80+)
- 46 participants



# Citizen summits: Recruitment & insights

#### How were participants recruited?

- Special interest groups (e.g. seniors)
- Project & stakeholder mailing lists
- Social media (LinkedIn, Facebook)
- GGD ZL Burgerpanel
- Friends & colleagues
- €20 voucher incentive

#### **Key insights**

- Open format: low reach
- Targeting special interest groups more efficient
- But Quality > quantity: Rich exchange
- Topic (climate & health) low pull



# Pop-Up engagement – Format overview

#### Why this format?

- Casual, low-threshold setting
- Engage with broad audience (e.g. age, gender, education)

#### How did it work?

- Quick intuitive feedback on self-chosen topics out of the PST EMR
- Large Spiderweb poster as visual guide
- Topics were rated using Post-Its
- Short conversations with individuals & small groups

#### Where?

- Three-Country-Party in Landgraaf
- EU-Day in Vaals



# Pop-Up engagement: Insights

#### Who?

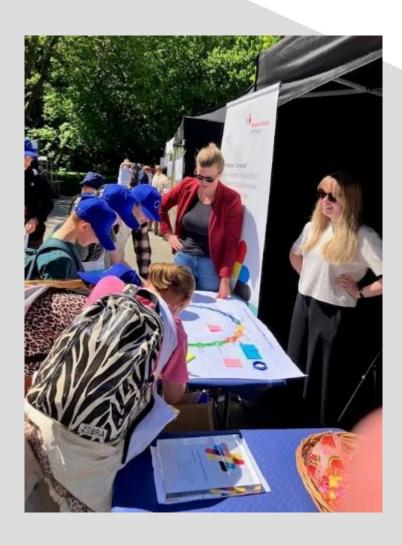
- Euregional Citizens of all ages
- Approx. 200 participants

#### How were participants recruited?

- Inviting tent setup
- Small giveaways: Candy, Pens, Key Chains
- Colorful spiderweb poster & Post Its drew people in

#### **Key insights**

- Easy to attract, but limited depth of discussion
- Participants chose personally relevant topics
  - Public transport
  - Healthcare
  - Shopping
  - Green spaces





# Online participation: Format overview

#### Why this format?

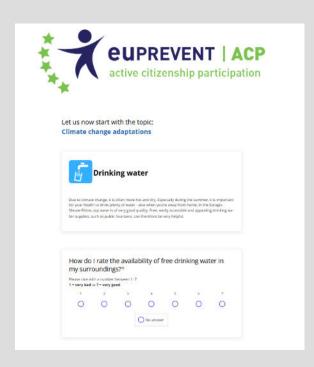
- Reach a broader EMR audience
- Allow individual, flexible participation.

#### How?

- Digital version of the PST EMR
- Available in Dutch, French, German and English
- Climate module mandatory, others optional
- Participants gave:
  - Ratings per theme
  - Qualitative feedback

#### Who?

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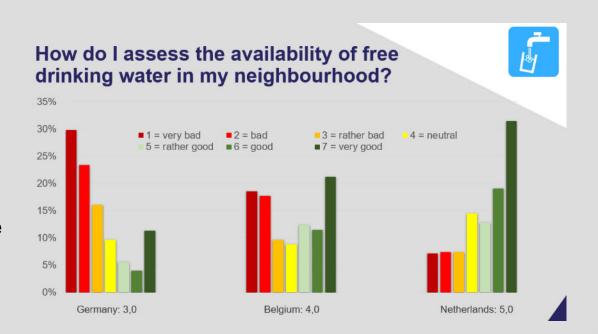
# Online participation: Insights

#### How were participants recruited?

- Online campaign on LinkedIn and Facebook
- GGD ZL Burgerpanel
- Personal contacts
- Press releases

#### **Key insights**

- Many participants from GGD ZL Burgerpanel
- Online campaign ensured geographical & age diversity
- Low drop-out rates
- Most participants completed entire PST EMR, not just climate module
- Online tool as supportive measure





### **Results - Positive Momentum**

# What works well related to climate change and health in the EMR

- Green spaces and tree planting are seen as effective and desirable
- Citizens are motivated to engage –
   especially when results are visible
- Public awareness is growing:
  - More people recognize links between climate change & health
  - Topics like heat stress, clean air, and water access are increasingly



# Results – Climate & Health Challenges in the EMR



#### **Key Concerns Identified by Citizens:**

- Lack of free public drinking water & cooling spaces
- Limited access to information during heatwaves and floods.
- Participation formats (e.g., long surveys) often exclude certain groups

#### **Citizens ask for Cross-Border Preparedness**

- Joint early warning system for floods, heat, and storms
- One coordinated, visible system across BE–DE– NL
- Shared emergency response strategy & joint infrastructure
- Inclusive, low-threshold participation methods

### Climate Change, Health & Citizen Voice: What's at Stake?

- Climate change affects health and knows no borders
- Top-down policies alone fail to solve "wicked" problems
- Citizens must be meaningfully included especially in crossborder regions
- Euroregion Meuse-Rhine 3.9M citizens
- Floods, COVID-19 → need for collaboration
- PST EMR= adapted tool with 14 themes + climate/health lens

#### **Research Questions:**

- How do citizens and stakeholders perceive the Adapted Place Standard Tool in fostering cross-border participation on climate change and health issues in the Euroregion Meuse-Rhine?
- What are the key barriers and enablers to citizen participation in climate change and health through the Adapted PST?

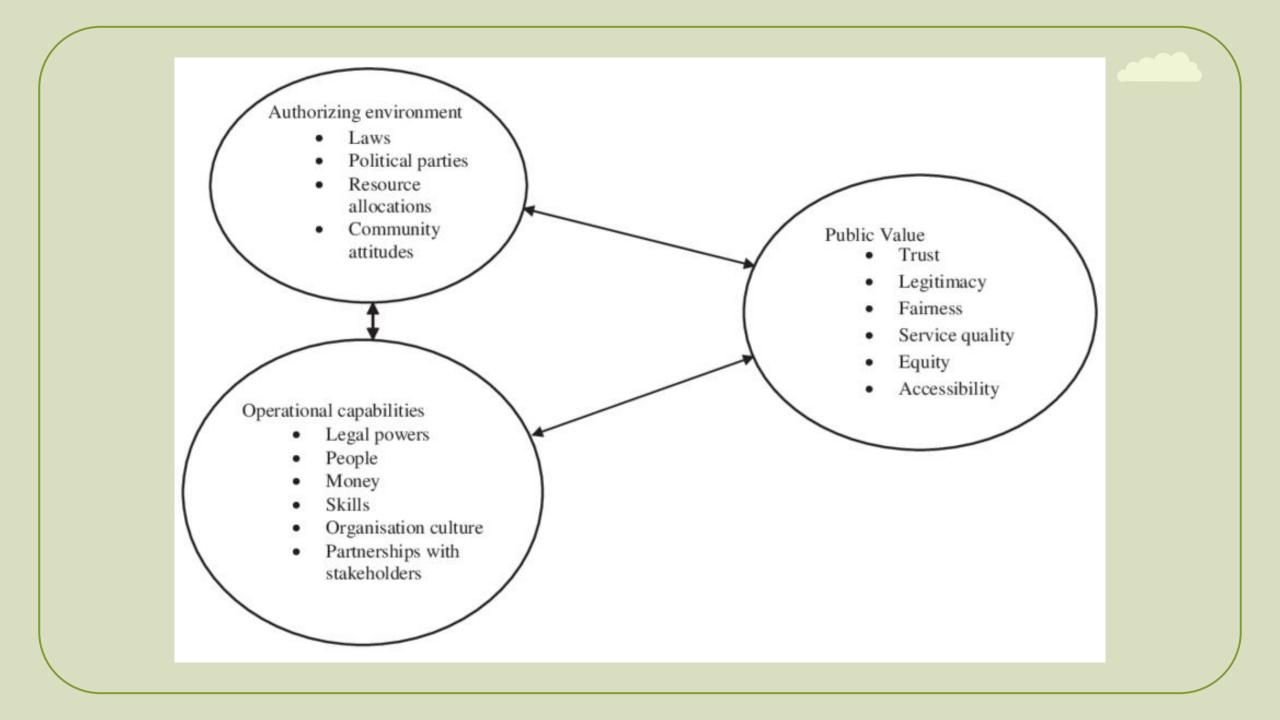
#### Aim:

• To evaluate how the Adapted PST supports cross-border citizen engagement and identify barriers/enablers to participation.



### Research Design & Methodology

- Approach: Qualitative research
- Methodology: Semi-structured interviews with 12 participants: citizens and experts
- Theoretical Framework: Public Value Theory (Strategic Triangle)
  - Authorizing Environment
  - Operational Capabilities
  - Public Value



### **Participants & Demographics**

- 7 students, 5 professionals
- 66% from Netherlands
- Underrepresented: Belgium

Theme 1: The Role of Policies, Laws and Community Attitudes in Citizen Participation in Climate Change

"The laws of the national systems don't allow more cooperation"

- Conflicting national laws block participation
- Community attitudes shaped by politics, history
- Younger & urban groups more active

# Theme 1: The Role of Policies, Laws and Community Attitudes in Citizen Participation in Climate Change

"I think the system in the Netherlands is based on diplomas. So, if you have a high diploma your input is maybe seen as more valid compared to someone who's not an expert...So, I think the system hinders participation." (expert)

"I don't think we're being hindered...we had a lot of actions that were supported but most of these come from the citizens themselves and they are supported. There is a lot that is possible." (citizen)

### Theme 2: The PST EMR as a Conversation Starter, Not Just a Survey

- Encourages meaningful conversations, not passive answers.
- Enhances perspective-sharing in group settings.
- Mixed feelings about how data is used after submission.

"I think it is useful as a conversation starter or as a guide to have a discussion with others, more than it is a survey." (expert)

#### Theme 3: Accessibility and equity of the PST EMR

#### **Hard-to-Engage Target Groups**

- Low SES → "If you are poor, sustainability is not high on your agenda... they
  care about survival."
- Low Literacy People
- Elderly
- Migrants
- Young Couples with Kids
- ADHD
- People with dyslexia → "People with dyslexia might struggle just because of the layout right now."

#### Theme 4: From Tokenism to Meaningful Participation

- Participation is often shallow, symbolic.
- Feedback loops are crucial to citizen participation
- Trust in institutions is low, especially among marginalized groups.

"Citizen Participation now is more like a check in the box" (expert)

"Citizen participation in my opinion is more than just giving input. It is also more bidirectional" (expert)

### Theme 5: Visions for a PST in Citizen Participation

- 1. "Make it Fun, Make it Simple, Make it Personal"
- 2. "Show Them Why Their Voice Matters"
- 3. Bringing people together
- 4. "Start Young!"

## **Recommendations for Future Research & Policy**

- Focus future research on marginalized voices (low SES, migrants, neurodivergent individuals).
- Assess the real-world application of the PST EMR in diverse contexts.
- Advocate for harmonized cross-border laws supporting participation.
- Create feedback mechanisms that loop input back to participants
- Show people why their voice matters
- Promote co-design approaches that involve citizens early in tool development.

### **Conclusion**

- The Adapted Place Standard Tool raises awareness among citizens
- The tool is beneficial in providing encouragement to participate
- It may struggle to fully engage citizens in participating due to differences in administrative systems, cultural norms, settings and history and accessibility problems.
- While the PST, can represent the start of something it might not create sustained impact without showing people why their voice matters.

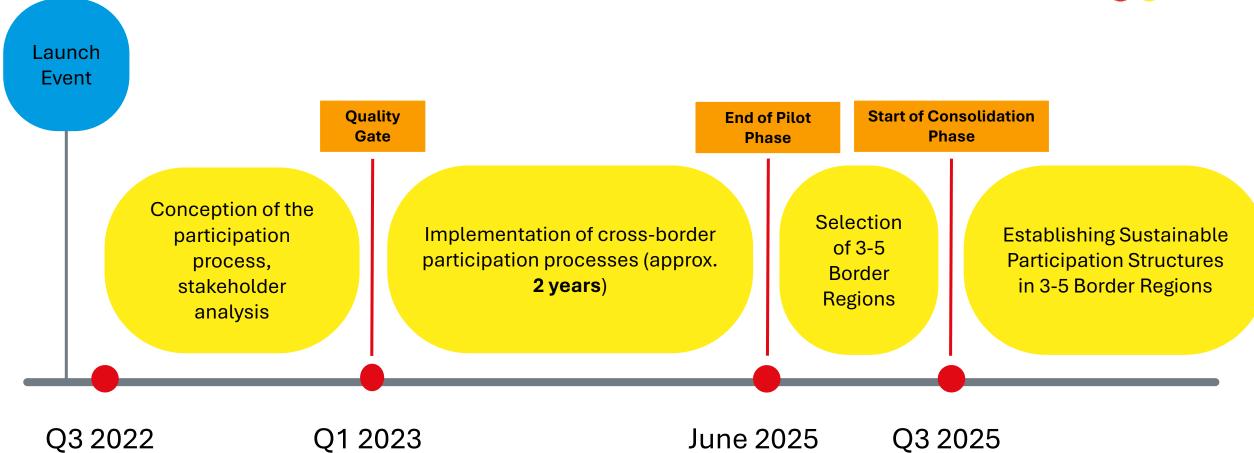
#### Scope of the funding

- Guidance and advice according to individual requirements
- Financial funding up to 1.6 Mio. € in total for the eight border regions
- Qualifications through advanced training courses
- Networking and peer learning events

# Cross border participation: Exmples and Learnings

## Climate friendly city centre, Frankfurt/Oder-Słubice (PL/DE)



**Goal:** Including citizens views in the planning for a climate-friendly, integrated cross-border city center by 2035

#### **Formats**

- Establishment of two civic tables ("talking benches")
- Citizen picnics (incl. excursions, exchanges, idea collection)
- Online surveys & thematic workshops

**Key learnings:** New citizen groups attracted for participation; project structure with many partners was too complex

**Institutionalization:** binational council for joint cross-border city planning, continuation in other projects (e.g. Interreg) ensured



## Stronger together, Neiße-Bober (PL/DE)



(Original) Goal: Improve cross-border risk & crisis communication

#### **Formats**

- Citizen dialogues
- Accompanying Citizen advisory council

#### **Key learnings**

- Try new formats & include fun activities to attract citizens
- Shared work between occasional (dialogues) and steady participant (advisory council) works well
- Professional facilitation needed

Institutionalization: Citizen advisory council will continue its work



## Trialogue in the border triangle

## (PL/CZ/DE)



**Goal:** Understanding different citizens perspectives/demands in order to design a just transformation process in the former mining region

#### **Formats**

- survey countries identifying interests of citizens
- Citizen participation workshops (measures and recommendations for common development plan of the "small triangle"

**Key learnings:** application of different methods improved mobilization/ recruitment of citizens

**Institutionalization:** a citizens' advisory board to accompany the transformation process in the next years will be established



## Spatial concept High Rhine (CH/DE)

**Goal:** Including citizens' perspective in the development of a cross-border spatial concept

#### Citizen participation formats

- Events for activating citizens: walking and bike tours
- Cross-border citizen panel

#### Key learnings

- Recruitment is very expensive
- communication plays an important role
- due to the size of the area, it is hardly possible to develop a sense of unity among the population in the border region

**Institutionalization:** Charta for implementation of citizens recommendations signed by municipalities; to be discussed





## Democracy in action, Emmendingen - PETR Sélestat Alsace (FR/DE)



Goal: Recommendations for the sustainable use of an island in the Rhine river

#### Citizen participation formats

- activating citizens: Climate brunch, bike tours, neighboring walks etc.
- Online survey / online participation platform
- Workshops (project ideas on energy, mobility, food, biodiversity)

#### Key learnings

- Activation of citizens and stakeholders is very time consuming
- Practical activities engage citizens who don 't attend trad. formats

**Institutionalization:** Partnerships of mayors on both side of the border in order to pursue the work on the islands with the engagement of citizens (including activating events to mobilize citizens)



## Borderless energy region Rosport/Mompach (LUX/DE)

## Ralingen-



**Goal:** Recommendations for moving closer to climate neutrality in the border region

#### **Formats**

- Events for activating citizens: excursion to solar panel field etc.
- Future workshops (developing scenarios)

#### Key learnings

- Recruitment beyond the usual suspects is challenging where "everybody knows everybody"
- Some topics are hard to work on because of existing laws

**Institutionalization:** To be discussed, possibly a cross-border working group of citizens & politicians



# Agglomeration Concept, SaarMoselle (FR/DE)

### Euroregion



Goal: Recommendations for a common spatial development of the border area

#### **Formats**

- Activating survey (strategic development of the Eurodistrict)
- Constitution of a cross-border citizen committee

#### **Key learnings**

- Activating survey are time and resource consuming
- Managing a cross-border committee is challenging
- Institutionalization of committee requires close collaboration with decisionmakers at different levels & depend political timing/ agenda

#### Institutionalization

 Institutionalization of citizen committee & transfer of participation process to the Eurodistrict SaarMoselle

Civic engagement helps foster a sense of ownership, empowerment, and social cohesion, ultimately leading to more effective and legitimate decision-making processes.





## **Open Government (OG)**

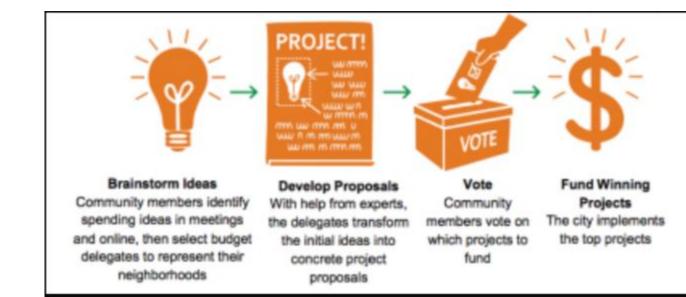
- Open Government (OG) as a concept for modernising the public sector is becoming increasingly prominent in recent debates in administrative science.

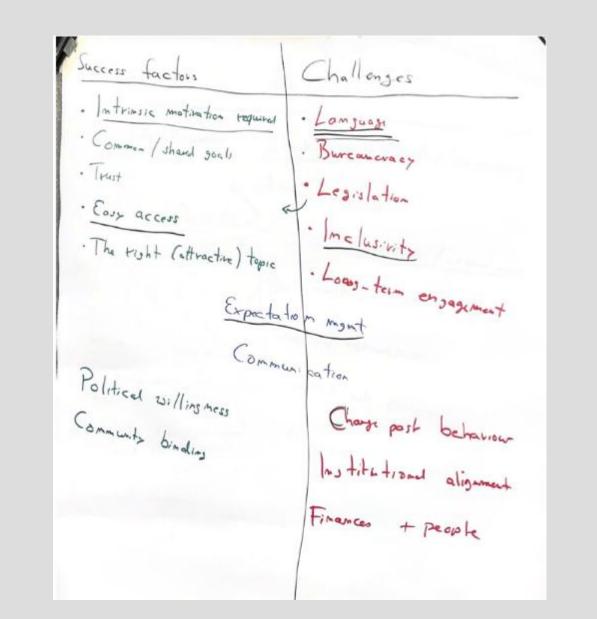

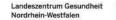
